

Oblationers Represent All Gathered

Representatives of the congregation bring the people's offerings of bread and wine, and money or other gifts, to the deacon or celebrant. The people stand while the offerings are presented and placed on the Altar.
page 361, Book of Common Prayer

This instruction is directed toward the congregants gathered for Holy Communion. While there are many opportunities for lay people to serve in different aspects of the service as lay readers, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, and ushers, the opportunity to serve as an oblationer is especially appropriate for anyone who may just be sitting in the pew during the service. Individuals, couples, and families can serve as oblationers, carrying forward the wine and bread at the end of the Offertory.

There are no trainings needed and no requirements to meet, just a willingness to represent the gathered congregation. If you would like to represent the congregation by bringing the wine and bread forward to the altar, simply ask an usher before the service.



Rector's Column

As we head into the summer months, there will be much in the way of transition at St. Andrew's. Before I get to that, I want to share something helpful to me that I was reminded of recently, and it is a simple teaching that comes from the Islamic poet and mystic, Rumi. Rumi writes: "Before you speak, let your words pass through three gates: at the first gate, ask yourself "Is it true?" At the second gate ask, "Is it necessary?" At the third gate ask, "Is it kind?"

I am trying (and often failing!) to live more into Rumi's three gates regarding what I choose to or not to say. Nothing about this is easy, nor does any of this come naturally to me. But it is a good practice. As a country, we feel pretty divided right now. I believe that our role as people of faith is to help bridge the divisiveness that hurts all of us. Perhaps thinking more carefully about what we say, how we say it, or if it even needs to be said, might bring some needed healing to our country. I hope it does.

"Movin' Out" was the first song that Joe Perry and Steven Tyler of Aerosmith ever wrote together. It is also the first song on their self-titled debut released in 1973. As the title implies, the song is about moving (in this case moving due to encroaching urbanization). I mention this song for two reasons: first, Aerosmith dusted it off and played it recently at a concert in Las Vegas, and secondly, there will be a lot of moving this summer at St. Andrew's and in our diocese.

A New Office The Rev. Carissa Baldwin-McGinnis, former Associate Rector at St. Andrew's, began her church planting endeavor in January. Since that time, it has been a pleasure to have Carissa continue to office on our campus. Carissa has moved out of her office space at St. Andrew's to an area closer to the near northside of Houston. When Carissa told me that she would be "Movin' Out," I told her that one side of my face was smiling with joy while the other was shedding a tear. I will miss her but know that she is moving out to do great things.

A New Bishop On Saturday, June 1 at 11 AM, bishops will gather to ordain the Rev. Kathryn "Kai" Ryan as Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of Texas. Bishop-Elect Ryan will be working under the direction of Bishop Doyle, who is assigning her to the Austin area of our diocese, requiring her and her family to relocate to Austin from Houston. I hope that you will join me in keeping Bishop Ryan in your prayers as she becomes the newest bishop in our Diocese.

A New Deacon On June 22, our seminarian, Beth Woodson, will be ordained to the Diaconate at Christ Church Cathedral. The presence of Beth's ministry with us at St. Andrew's will extend long beyond her one year with us. She has faithfully served in worship on Sunday mornings, and her pastoral presence has been a blessing. A long time Houston homeowner, Beth recently sold her home, and purchased a new one in Georgetown, Texas. Our prayers go with her as she begins a new chapter in a new parish.

A New Curate In July, St. Andrew's will receive a curate, the Rev. Bradley Varnell. Bradley graduated from Duke Divinity School in May and will be moving to Houston in July, and his first Sunday with us will be July 28. Bradley will be with St. Andrew's a minimum of two years, and during this time, you will see a lot of him, as he will be full-time. I hope you will join me in welcoming Bradley to this congregation! Lots of moving, lots of change, lots to celebrate!

The Next Leg of This Journey

The experience of the Easter Vigil this year at St. Andrew's was a profound and wonderful experience for me. In light of the fact that we started at 6 am, I was not expecting that there would be very many people, but I was pleasantly surprised. There were over 50 of you by the end of the service. We lit the Vigil fire outside in the brazier and huddled around it in the cold spring morning air. The three children (two babies and a toddler) and one adult to be baptized were all there with their families as well as other stalwart parishioners. When we lit our candles from the Paschal candle and entered into the darkened nave I was so struck by the chant "The Light of Christ" and our response: we literally brought light into the world of that space. Those beautiful prayers ascended as we continued to pray the ancient prayers of the liturgy, the presence of God's spirit was ushered in and tangibly magnified. As we baptized the children and adults, there was just a holy silence as the water poured golden in the candlelight over their heads. I found myself reflecting on how many thousands through the centuries had come along this holy road in just the same manner as we did. I felt deeply connected to all the saints (big and little S) past and present and future...timeless and eternal.

This is just one of the many memories I will carry with me from my season at St. Andrew's. These nine months have passed very quickly, and I am sad to say that I will be leaving you soon. June 2 will be my last Sunday and I will be ordained to the transitional diaconate on June 22 with other seminarians at Christ Church Cathedral. Please know that you are welcome, and I would be honored by your presence. The service will begin at 10 am with a reception following.

Recently I moved 30 miles north of Austin to Georgetown and have begun to settle in. Following my ordination I will begin as a Deacon, holding services at a small church in the Georgetown area come September. In December, I will be ordained to the priesthood and will then become the vicar at that church.

I have really enjoyed my fieldwork experience with all of you at St. Andrew's and I know that your weekly prayers for me in the Prayers of the People have carried me through. I will miss all of you and hope to come back and visit from time to time.



Concerts Supported Numerous Charities
